Mesta Meadows sells a very limited number of Great Pyreneese livestock guard dogs each year. Our focus is on providing Great Pyreneese who will be working livestock guard dogs, but who are also exceptional 'companion dogs' on the farm. We typically do not provide GP's as pure 'companion dogs' since we feel they are happiest when they are engaged and working on a farm.

We raise the puppies to 8 weeks. We don't keep them longer because we feel it is important that they are acclimated to their new home and that they bond with the livestock they will be guarding from a very young age. We will expose the puppies to cattle, sheep, and all of our livestock from about three weeks old forward. All puppies will have their first rabies shot, be dewormed, and vet checked prior to being released. We do require applications for all of our puppy placements.

PART III: LIVESTOCK AND COMPANION DOG
Spay/neutered dogs usually make better livestock guardian dogs and companions. They guard just as well or better than intact dogs. Bitches in heat must be confined for three weeks or longer every six to eight months and have been known to be irritable with both people, livestock and other animals. Males can be distracted from their stock when a female is in season nearby and can also be more irritable with people, livestock, other animals. Dog breeding is time-consuming and provides little profit when done carefully and properly. Careful placement of pups is essential for a successful integration with new families and livestock. Breeders should e able to raise and test their dogs with livestock in order to verify that those traits are important in livestock protection are maintained. Dedicated and responsible breeders are welcome.
